Program Costs and Financial Support

All students are admitted to the program with some form of financial support that includes coverage of 12 hours per semester of tuition expenses. 12 hours per semester is the standard credit load for students in this program. Support mechanisms include fellowships, research assistantships, and teaching assistantships.

The minimum package for students entering 2014-15 is a 4-year financial support package that includes an annual stipend, a tuition scholarship, and health insurance. The minimum stipend is \$14,000 for the 10 month academic year. Summer stipends may be available.

Students supported as teaching assistants are asked to work 10 hours per week during the academic year helping faculty with class work. After the first year, teaching assistants are asked to work 20 hours per week. After the third year, students may be asked to teach classes as instructor of record.

The tuition scholarship covers the maximum remittable portion of 12 hours of credit each Fall and Spring semester. Students are responsible for approximately \$40-\$50 out-of-pocket expense for each remitted credit hour and approximately \$800.00 per semester in incidental fees including a general and a temporary repair and rehabilitation fee. Based on 2014-15 tuition rates, the tuition scholarship has an annual monetary value of approximately \$8,620.80 for Indiana residents or \$24,168 for non-residents. Since our inception in 1996, the Clinical Psychology program has been successful in providing four years of continuous support to all PhD students who are in good standing in the program. Although this support is not guaranteed, we have every expectation that we will be able to provide this level of support in the future.

Licensure:

Of the students who graduated from 2004-12, 89% are licensed. However, many of our graduates are in research jobs where licensure is not required, so they do not apply for it. Of the students who graduated from 2004-12 who applied for licensure, 100% are licensed.
